Background

The transnational Programme South East Europe is part of the new objective 3 European Territorial Co-operation (2007-2013)

Transnational co-operation concentrates on limited number of priority areas in line with the Lisbon and Gothenburg processes: Innovation, Environment, Accessibility and Sustainable Urban Development (Art 6 of the ERDF Regulation 1080/2006)

The program includes 16 countries (8 Member States, 6 Accession and pre-Accession countries) and presents one of the most complex transnational co-operation areas in Europe

SEE eligible area

- *Member States*: Austria, Bulgaria, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Slovakia, Slovenia, Romania
- *Non-EU-member States*: Albania, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Croatia, Former Yugoslav Republic of Mace-donia (FYROM), Serbia, Montenegro, Moldova, Ukraine

(Italy and Ukraine do not participate with its whole territory.)

Programme area

One of the most diverse and complex transnational co-operation area

Small and medium size countries, „border-density“ is very high

Substantial economic, social, infrastructural, technological differences

Political, cultural, social, ethnical, religious diversity

Financial provisions (Member States)

- ERDF budget: € 206 691 645
- National public funding: € 38 420 329
- Total budget: € 245 111 974
- Co-financing rate (projects): 85% ERDF

Involvement of non-member states

It is one of the most crucial element of the SEES programme

- Harmonization of IPA (Instrument for Pre-Accession) and ENPI funds with ERDF
- Application of the **10% rule** for external partner countries (ERDF may finance expenditure incurred on the territory of countries outside the European Community up to a limit of 10% of the amount of its contribution to the SEES programme). Specific eligibility rules are to be applied.
