

- Montenegro and Serbia are independent states, 2006
- Kosovo 17 February, 2008?
- 20 March 2010, Incomplete Brdo Western Balkans Summit, state policy domination of bilateral and multilateral territorial co-operations

Vienna European Council meeting, December 1998, forming Western Balkans, as new political space category


- Zagreb 2000, Thessaloniki Summits 2003
- March 2003 'Western Balkan Five' Albania, BiH, Croatia, Macedonia, and Serbia-Montenegro - modified political space
- 2004 EU membership of Slovenia New posibilities and EU influences
- 2008: Western Balkan Seven

Co-operations in regional development, and physical planning

- EU influence and pressure on:
- National development plans national level connections
- Regional (NUTS 2) development plans and programmes 'Regional level connections'
- Inter-county (NUTS 3) connections, co-operations, projects
- Inter-settlement connections, co-operations, projects

- Double and triple border corners
- Different types of state borders: open, traditional bilateral, Schengen, military

Territorial (open and first of all hidden) discussions


Border (open and hidden) discussions
